He also shared due to the COVID-19 outbreak our department was taking a \$1million hit. We have had 30% of our members reactive their membership at this time. Lake Bentonville / Osage Park Update

Allison updated everyone on Lake Bentonville. Due to rainfall and COVID-19 the project has been greatly impacted by these two factors. The boardwalk, fishing docks, restrooms, and parking have all been completed. The playground and pavilion will be completed in the next couple of weeks. The construction is projected to be completed by end of July 2020. The vegetation is starting to grow, however it will take a couple of years to have the 55 acres completed with all landscaping. The Archery Range is scheduled to be complete by the end of the year. This will be located on the south side of the park. It is currently no open to the public.
