Neighborhood Tree Planting

What is the Neighborhood Tree Planting Program?

The City of Bentonville's Neighborhood Tree Planting Program makes it easy for Bentonville residents to obtain trees to plant in their neighborhoods. The city pays for and orders the trees. Neighborhood residents plant and care for the trees.

What Neighborhoods are Eligible?

All neighborhoods that are approved participants in the Great Neighborhoods Program at the Active Level are eligible to participate.

Are there Planting Location Requirements?

Yes. Trees are required to be planted in the public realm, including within the right-of-way, around detention ponds, in neighborhood parks, or a combination.

When are Applications Due?

Applications may be submitted through July 20, 2022 .

When will the Tree Planting Take Place?

The tree planting will take place in later 2022.

What Tree Species are Included in the Program? Sugar Maple, Trident Maple, Oak, Pecan, Elm, American holly, redbud, dogwood, Thornless Hawthorn, Fringe Tree

What Size are the Trees?

Depending on availability, the trees will vary between 1.5 and 2-inches in caliper, which is a 15 gallon tree. Caliper size is defined as the measurement of the diameter of the trunk 6-inches above ground level.

What about Utilities?

It is the property owner's responsibility to locate utilities. Before you dig, call 811. <http://www.arkonecall.com/>. Trees cannot be planted within 5 feet of underground utilities or under overhead utilities.
