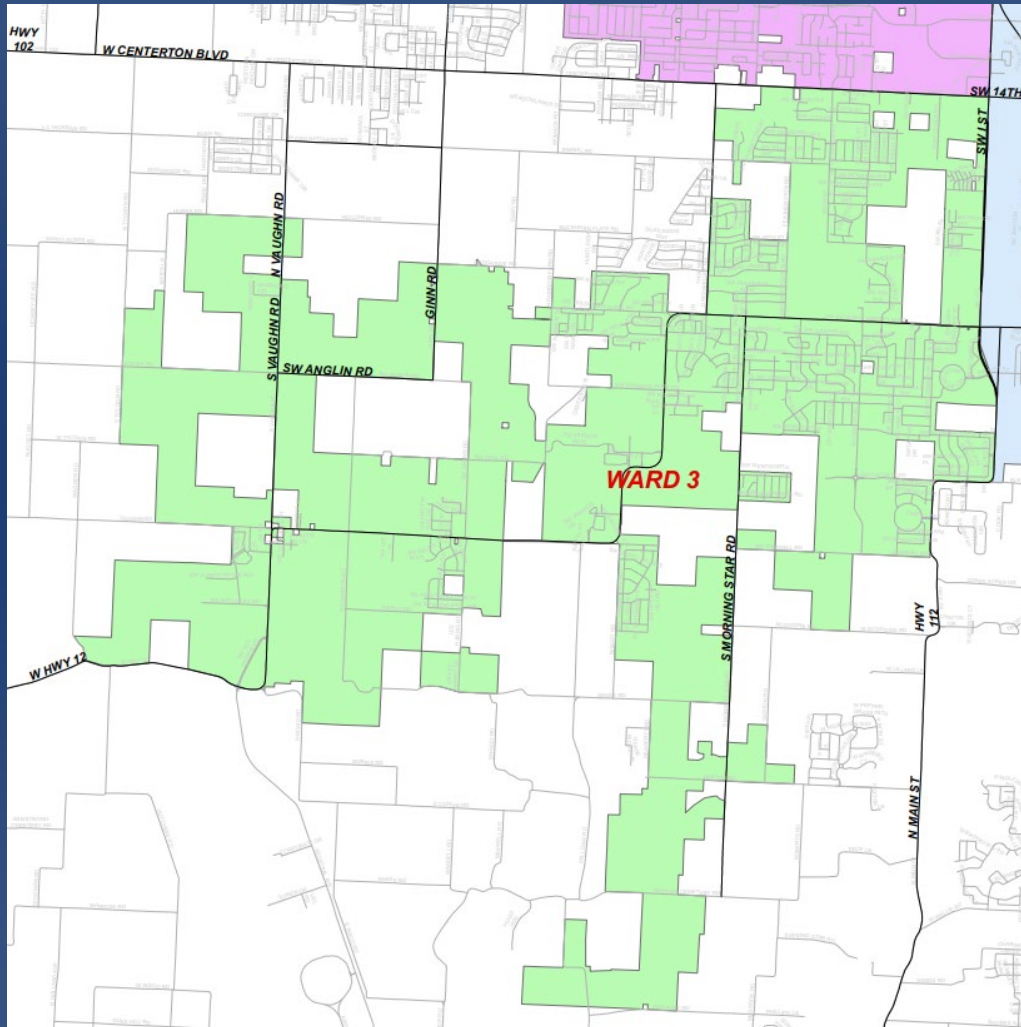

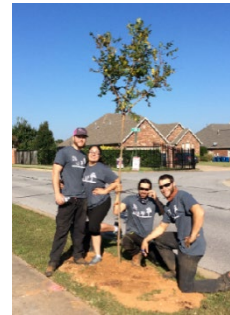
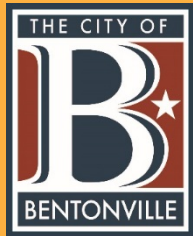
Storm Debris Collection

- Pickup beginning Wednesday, September 11th at 7:00 a.m.
- Deadline to sign up is Friday, September 6th. Call (479) 271-5966 OR sign up tonight.
- Debris must be placed within 4 to 10-feet from back of curb or edge of pavement. Keep debris out of drainage ditches and roadways.
- Tree limbs, shrubs, tree trunks, etc. shall not exceed 6-feet in length or 24-inches in diameter.
- No stumps.
- Bentonville property owners may also take material to the city's Compost Facility located at 2000 NW A Street during normal operating hours. Residents will need a current utility bill and picture ID for Bentonville residency verification.

Philosophy

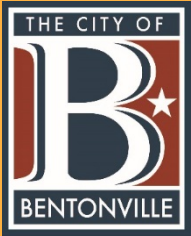

All exterior property must be free from the accumulation of rubbish & garbage.



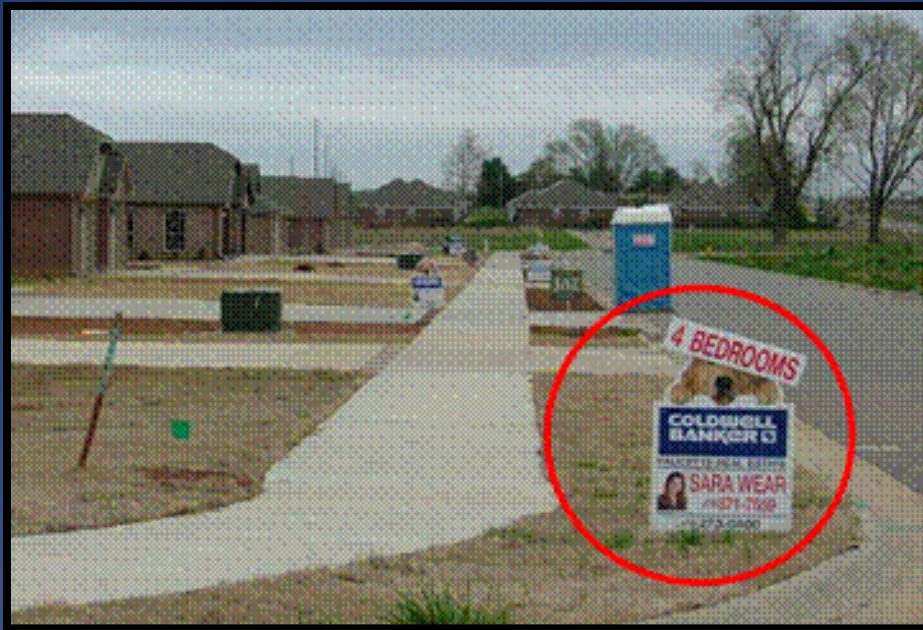
Inoperable Vehicles

Hwy 71B Intersection Improvements – SPUI

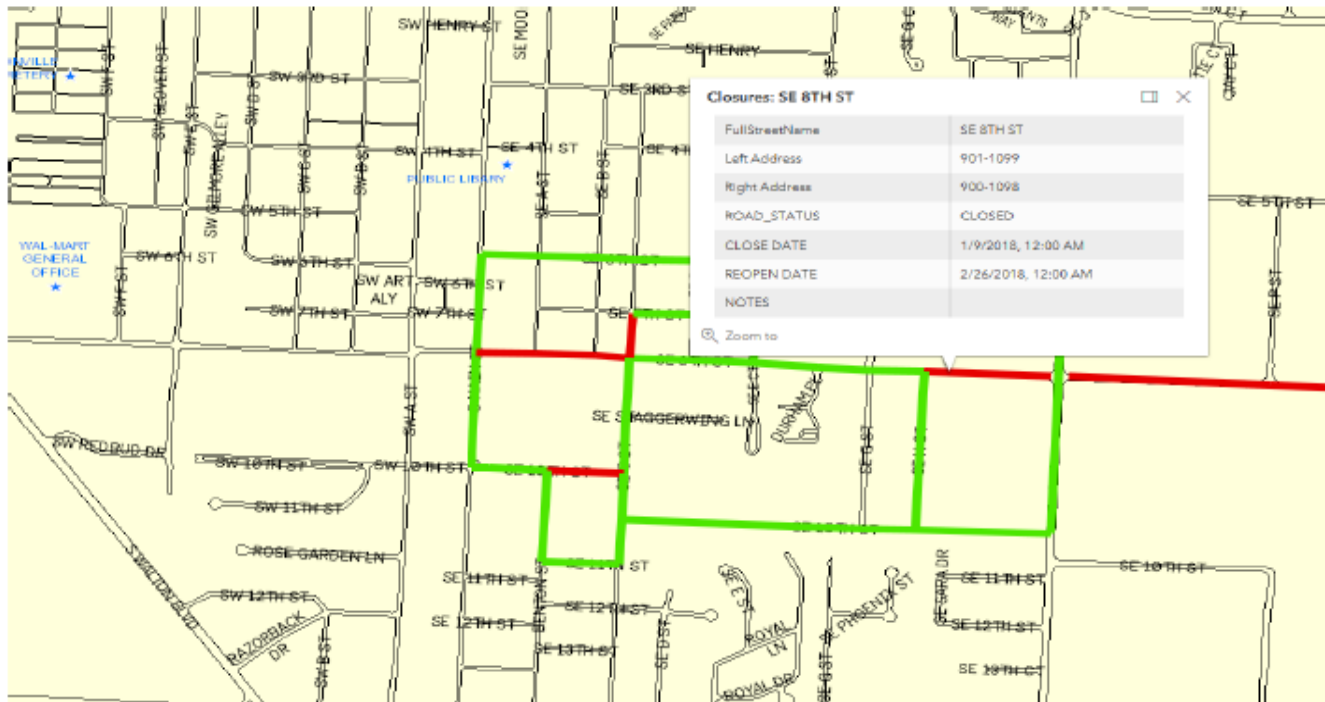
Also to replace roundabout at Hwy 71B north, near Bella Vista with similar design

Electric Utilities (Not Carroll)

Travis Matlock, Engineering Director

- Tree trimming
 - Required to maintain system reliability (99.99%, 10 min average/account)
 - 10' from the actual line
 - May find some spots that are in violation, BEUD only has 1 crew maintaining the whole city
- Reporting an outage (app/website/IVR)
 - Before reporting the outage, check your main breaker. If BEUD comes out and it was a “customer issue”, there is a \$100 service charge. Also, check your meter and see if the digital read out is still up. If it is, it is on the customer side.
 - The App (Apple Store/Google) is the easiest/quickest way to report the outage.
 - Update your phone number.
