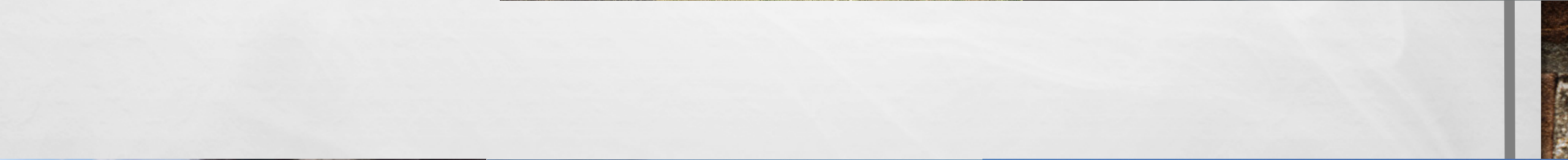

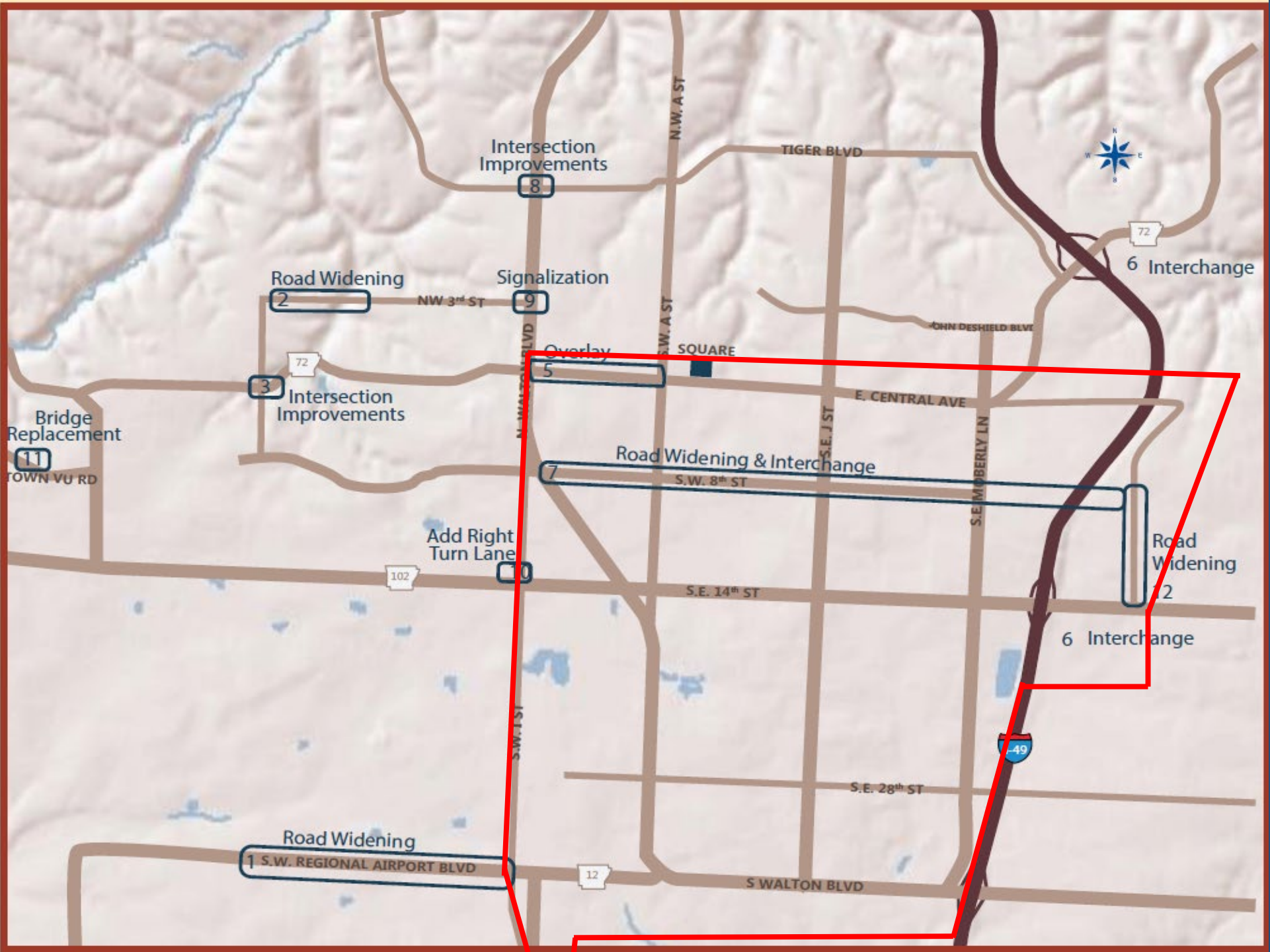

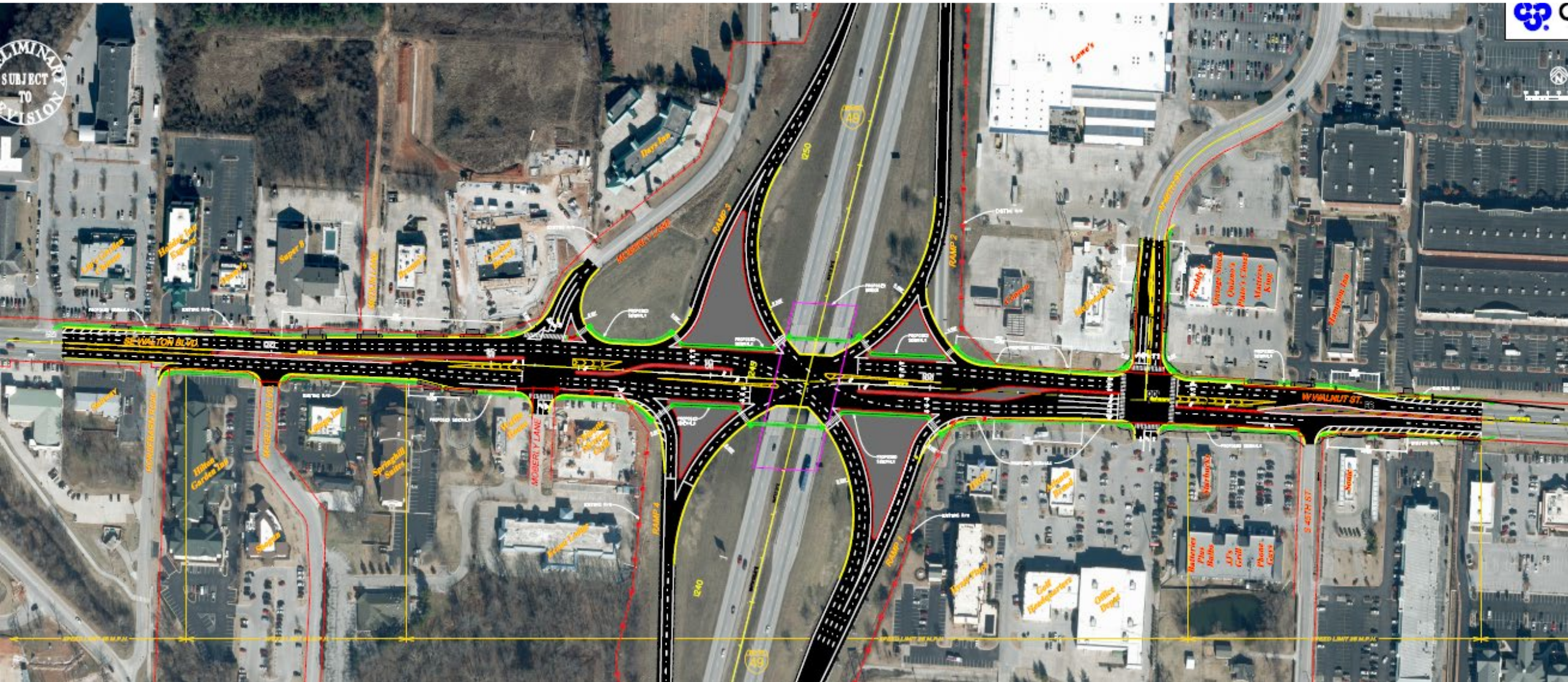

- Widen Water Tower Road to SE 14th Street

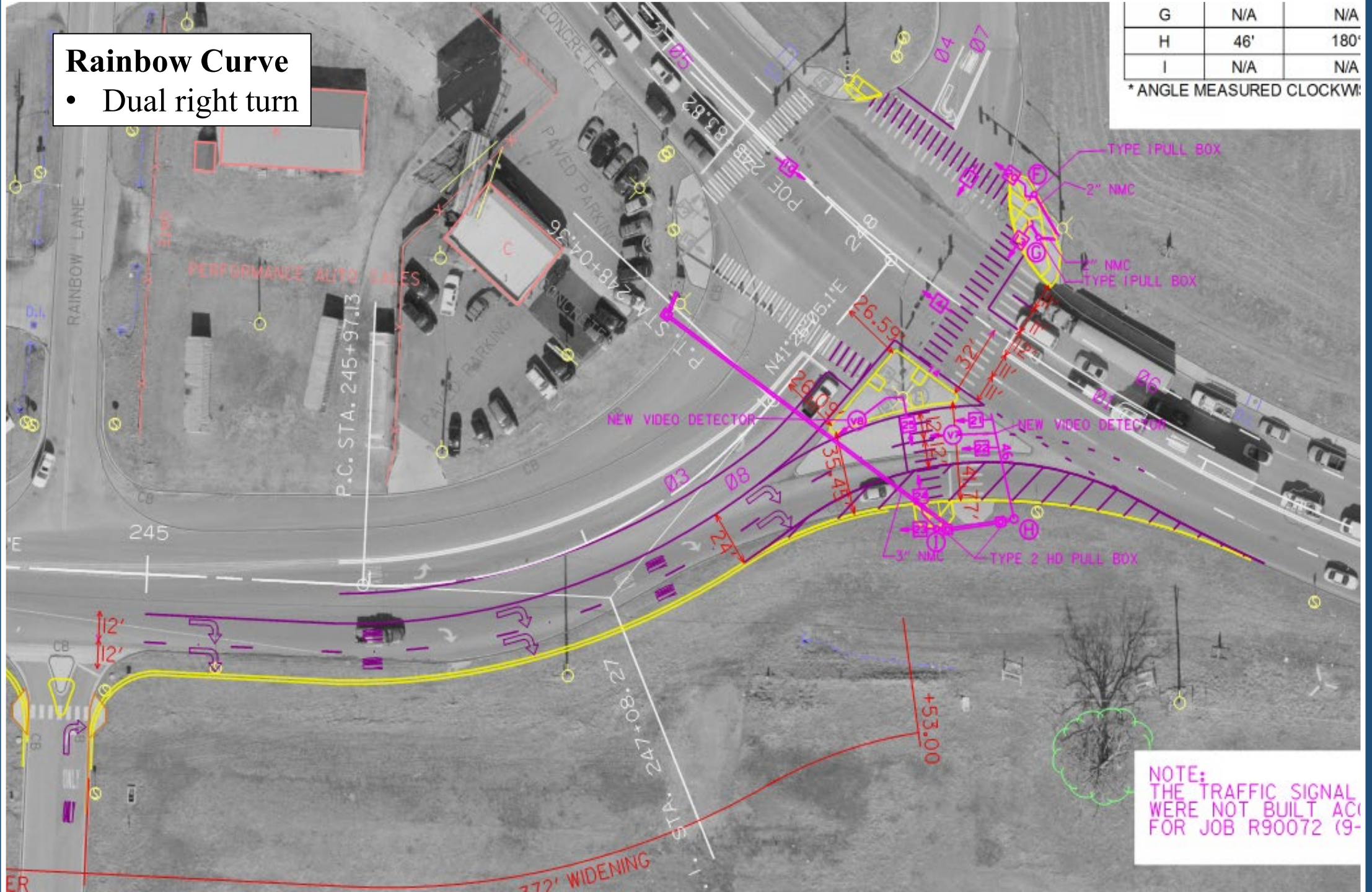


Rainbow Curve

Electric Utilities (Not Carroll)

- **Tree Trimming**

- Required to maintain system reliability (99.99%, 10 minute average/account).
- 10' from the actual line.
- May find some spots that are in violation, BEUD only has 1 crew maintaining the whole city.

- **Reporting an Outage (app/website/IVR)**

- Before reporting the outage, check your main breaker. If BEUD comes out and it was a “customer issue”, there is a \$100 service charge. Also, check your meter and see if the digital read out is still up. If it is, it is on the customer side.
- The app (Apple Store/Google) is the easiest/quickest way to report the outage.
- Update your phone number.

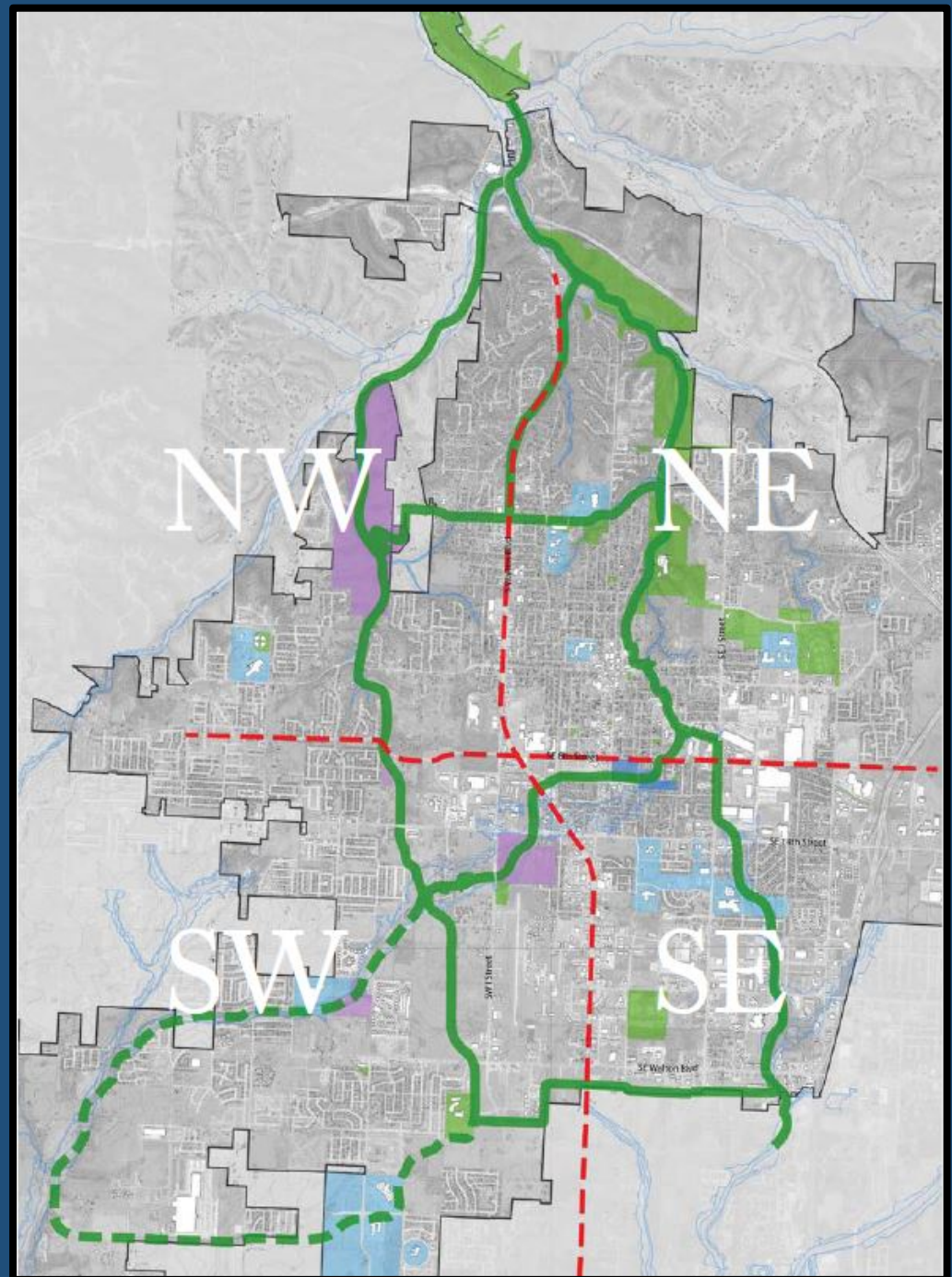

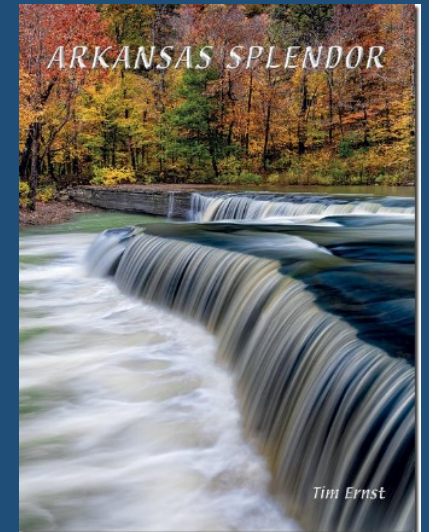

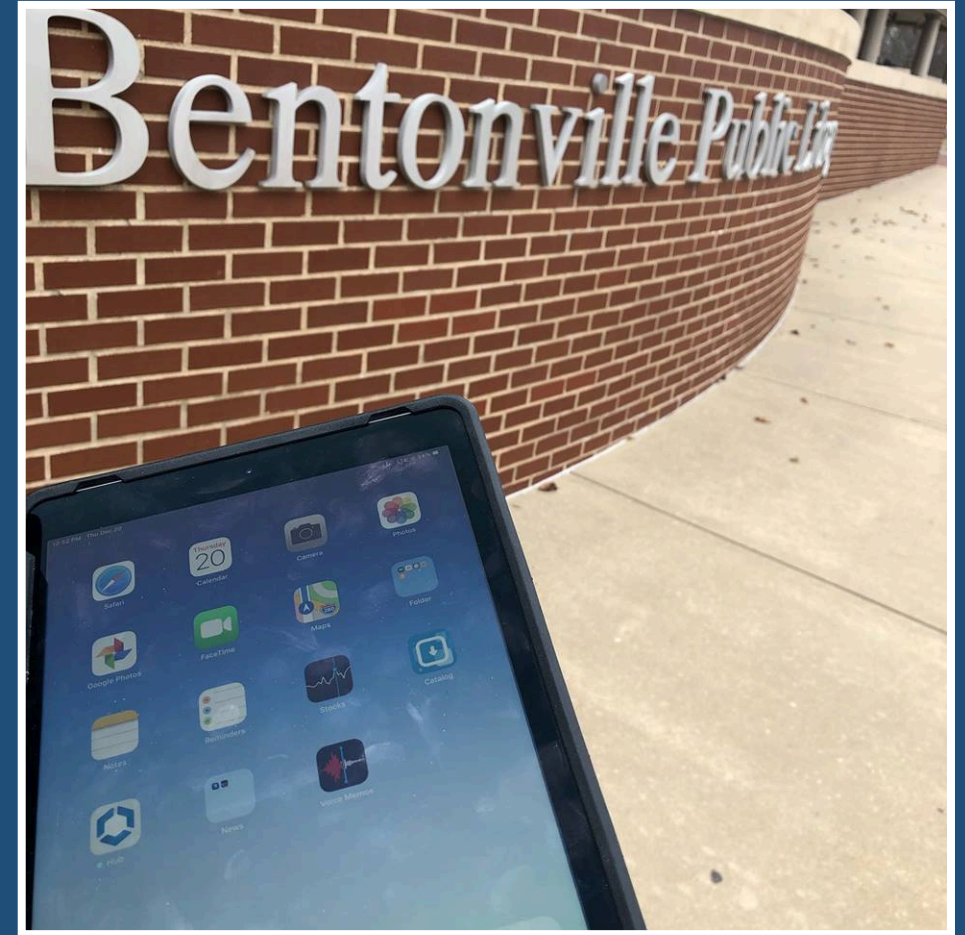
