

In the kitchen

Clogged sink drains can ruin your home, too! Keep all sinks in your home clog-free by following these simple steps:

- Fruit and vegetable stickers belong in the trash, not the drain.
- Always pour or scrape cooled fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage. Never pour fats, oils or grease down sink drains or toilets.
- Soak up remaining oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels and throw into your garbage.



- Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage or compost.

Recycle turkey fryer grease at the Benton County Solid Waste District. Do not pour down the sink drain, stormdrain or sewer.



Properly disposing of household hazardous waste is vital and we make it easy! Common household products wreak havoc on the city sewer system when poured down a drain or flushed down a toilet. Never dump cooking oil or grease, paint, paint thinner, cleaning chemicals, pesticides, fertilizer, root killer, medications or any product that has a CAUTION-WARNING-DANGER-POISON label. Instead, contact the Benton County Solid Waste District for information on their Household Hazardous Waste Facility and local disposal options for these materials. Did you know?

"Flushable Wipes" are the biggest problem for sewer backups in our community. That's right, even if the package says "flushable," they should NEVER be flushed. They belong in the trash.

Flush ONLY toilet paper. Put trash in the trash can.
